## How a Hurricane Built a Racetrack

After Hurricane Andrew tore through Miami in 1992, longtime Miami motorsports promoter Ralph Sanchez worked with Homestead City Manager Alex Muxo to build a track that would revitalize the area. Initially created as a 1.5 mile version of the Indianapolis Motor Speedway, the track later saw renovations to increase banking in the turns and create the more standard oval that exists today.
